



1.1) How would you rate your instructor as an effective teacher?





- Bonsoon is a great professor. I really hope UCLA hires him once he graduates so he can teach other math courses. He's funny and tells random stories during class, but he doesn't go off on long tangents and stays on topic. He is great at explaining the material, and I find his tests fair (so far). I would say the first midterm was much easier than the second one, but I think they evened out so the grade distribution is more "normal" looking.

The only weakness is that he tends to run class late, so I'm always rushing to my 11am.

- Bonsoon is a very engaging instructor and keeps class interesting. In addition, he is able to clearly convey the course material to students. It is very easy to ask him questions about the material, as he has 4 official hours of office hours per week. He implements weekly quizzes, which provide more practice for the material in preparation for midterms and final. Grading is fair. I would like to have been able to get solutions for the practice midterms.

Course does not cover as much as I would have liked.

33A should be a prerequisite to this course, so less time is spent on review/teaching of linear algebra material. (Review of concepts is nice, but I would also like to spend more time on current material).
